




























BMCNO Memorial Rallye this Saturday

Our Baton Rouge group will have breakfast at the normal time of 7 a.m. at The Warehouse, then the meeting time for the Rallye is 10:30 at the Circle K gas station (formerly Shell) at the I-12/Juban Rd exit to the south. These rules are provided to create a safe parade experience for participants, spectators and event staff. Failure to follow these rules may result in immediate removal of your entry from the parade. We appreciate your cooperation in continuing to make this a safe and enjoyable community event.

These rules were developed from reviewing accidents from other parades across the United States that resulted in a serious injury or fatality. Fortunately, the Harahan Police Department Christmas Parade has not had any serious injuries or fatalities in the past, and we would like to keep that record going, with your help and cooperation.


